According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) fire departments in the United States of America responded to an average of over 1000 fires each day in 2015. In that year, from house fires alone 2,560 civilians lost their lives.

Today's household products and furnishings burn hotter and faster than their precursors of 50 years ago. This coupled with the use of modern lightweight construction methods significantly decreases the amount of time to escape a house fire.
